This month Sustainable Silicon Valley hosted an engaging discussion on water and climate change at the The Tech Museum of Innovation for the Creative Collisions event. SSV's Water Advisory Council member and Senior Consultant to ARUP, Raphael Sperry, led a dynamic conversation. SSV Chief Development Officer, Cindy Clark, and SSV Water Director Dee Sreedhar also participated, answering attendees' questions about onsite water reuse.

In September, SSV will hold a Regulators Workshop with the CA Building Standards Commission and the CA Dept. of Housing and Community Development. Later in the fall, we will host SSV's Fall Water Workshop: Collaboration and Connections. SSV is also rolling out an Employee Engagement Program and launching a Water Reuse Case Study Database.

Next month, join SSV for the Ecumenical Hunger Program (EHP)'s Blockfest 2016 Party on August 13 in East Palo Alto. With a grant from the Mitsubishi Corporation, SSV is overseeing the installation of solar on the warehouse building which will be unveiled at BlockFest. SSV partners BAAQMD and SunWork will also be at the event. 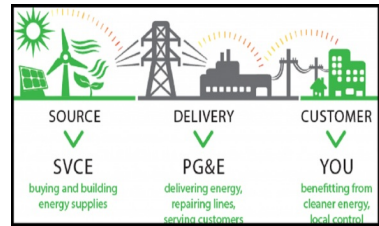
